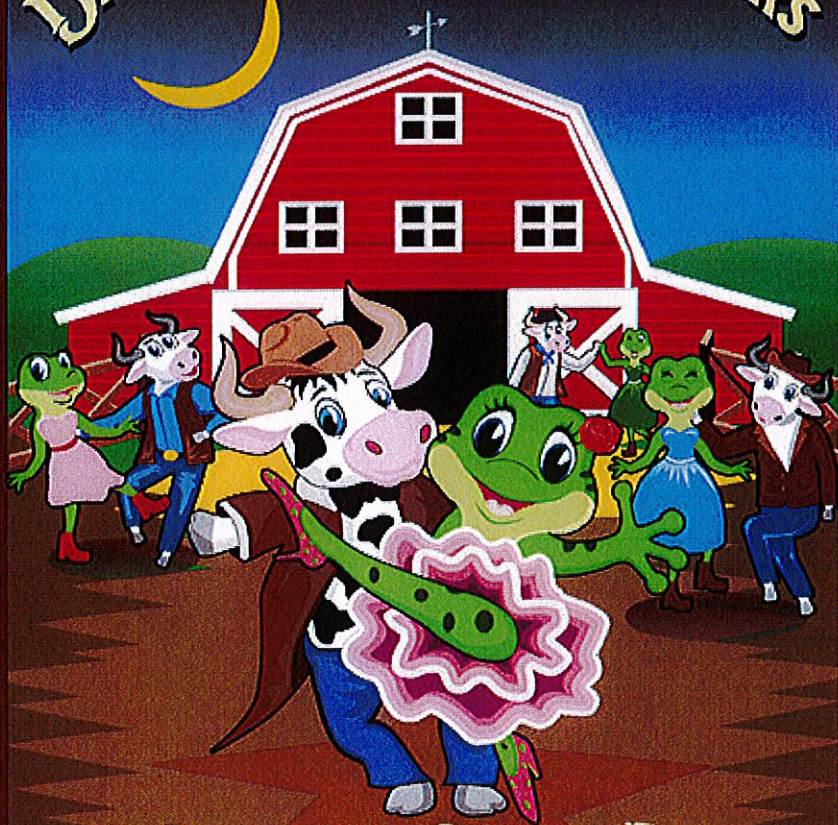

Updates shown in yellow.

A. Entry Forms:

- An entry form must be purchased for each frog to be jumped.
- No refunds on entry forms paid but not used.
- Entry forms from previous years cannot be used.
- By entering a frog, you agree to be photographed.
- Any photos will become the property of the Association and may be used in promotional efforts.

B. Frog Requirements:

- Must be at least four inches (4") from nose to tail.
- Must begin jump with all four (4) feet, including toes, on the eight inch (8") launch pad.
- No substitutions.
- Evidence of jumping the same frog twice will result in disqualification and forfeiture of prizes.
- No foreign substances permitted in the water.

C. Jump Officials:

In the background -

- Stage Manager oversees activity on the stage and has the final word in all situations.
- Entry Clerk collects entry forms and processes them to present to the Announcer.
- Recorders write jump results on entry forms.
- Timekeeper operates the clock for one minute jump requirement.
- Frog Handler moves rental frogs from buckets to individual jumpers.
- Runners take frogs from the Frog Spa to the Stage and back.

On the stage — Announcers, Stickmen, Measurers, Netters **and Judges.**

D. Rotation of Entries:

- Individuals/teams may enter a maximum of 20 frogs at one time.
- Entry forms must be turned into the Entry Clerk. To submit additional entries, you must go to the end of the line.
- Once a set of forms (max. of 20) are handed to the Entry Clerk; no more can be added to that set of 20.
- Entry Clerk takes the forms for each round and divides them into two groups:
 - First five go into the "5 Stack" slot on Recorders' table. These cannot be touched or changed.
 - Remaining entries in this round go into "15 Stack" slot on Entry Board. With Entry Clerk's approval and supervision these entries can be changed or removed until they reach the "5 Stack."

- Entry Clerk hands entries from the “5 Stack” to the Announcer.
- Entry Clerk moves entries five at a time from the “15 Stack” to the “5 Stack.”

E. Team Staging:

- Individuals/teams move onto the stage on a first-come, first-served basis.
- First three teams take the three tables on stage and must exit off once their jumps are completed.
- Stage Manager alerts those in next three positions of their impending jumps.
- Once alerted, teams have two minutes to take their tables onto the stage.
- Teams are not allowed to stack the line. Teams may occupy more than one table at discretion of the Stage Manager in cases of overlapping or delay in jump action

F. Jump Measuring and Procedures:

- The distance will be measured on the third jump in a straight line from the center of the pad to the tail of the frog. A walk or skip is counted as a jump.
- If a frog jumps into the Jockey or the Jockey’s equipment, the frog will be disqualified.
- If a frog jumps into other people or other people’s equipment on the stage, the Jockey may allow a re-jump or take the mark.
- In competitive jumping, only the frog jockey can bring the frog to the pad. Other team members must remain off the carpet.
- During the jump, only the person jockeying the frog may move ahead of the launching pad.
- “Off the pad!” and disqualification can and should be called by the judges and announcer, and echoed by stick and tape team.
- “No mark!!” can only be called by the Frog Jockey, and no distance will be measured for their frog.
- Netters shall remain off the carpet and shall not pursue the frog until the third jump is completed.
- The jump must occur within one (1) minute from start to finish.
- A one-minute clock will start when the Announcer announces the Jockey’s name.
- If the jump is not completed within one (1) minute the timer will sound and the frog will be disqualified.
- Touching the frog after it leaves the pad is cause for immediate disqualification.
- Any interference by a participant or team member may be cause for disqualification.
- All marks are final as determined by the Judges.
- Protests of any decision will follow the same procedure as other Fair event protests.
- Issues that affect the operation of the Frog Jump will be brought to the CEO’s attention..

G. Main Stage and Fun Jump Etiquette:

- No smoking or vaping is allowed in the Fun Jump area or Main Stage area.
- Unsupervised, disruptive children shall not be allowed on the Main Stage or behind the scenes.
- Photographers and writers will be directed to the Media Person.
- Only the designated Official Fair Photographer will be allowed unsupervised stage access.

- Any media attending the event shall use the dressing room with the lighted mirrors to store and recharge their equipment, after receiving permission from the Stage Manager.

G. Food and Beverage:

- All food donations will be run through the Front Office for clearance prior to the donation being made.
- No alcohol is permitted on the Main Stage, Fun Jump, or Frog Spa.
- Volunteers may purchase alcohol from approved event vendors, but shall not consume it on the Main Stage, Fun Jump or Frog Spa.
- Glass containers are not allowed in the Fairgrounds.

I. Frog Jump Volunteers:

- New volunteers will have an orientation session about the history of the event and the duties and responsibilities volunteers have in following Fair policies and procedures.
- A centralized list of volunteers will be prepared prior to the event, so that team managers shall have shared, specific information.
- Volunteer Admission and Parking Pass request information shall be provided to the Fair 10 days prior to the event and will include name and contact information.
- Costumes are limited to Western style attire.

J. Tickets for Frog Jump Entries:

- Tickets for entries for the Competitive Jump and Fun Jump shall be available for purchase at the Fair at a Ticket Booth near the jumping.
- Hours of operation for the Ticket Booth shall be posted. The Ticket Booth will close prior to the end of the jumping each day so that people waiting with paid entries in line will all be able to jump.
- Special purchases of a large amount of tickets shall be arranged prior to normal Ticket Booth hours.

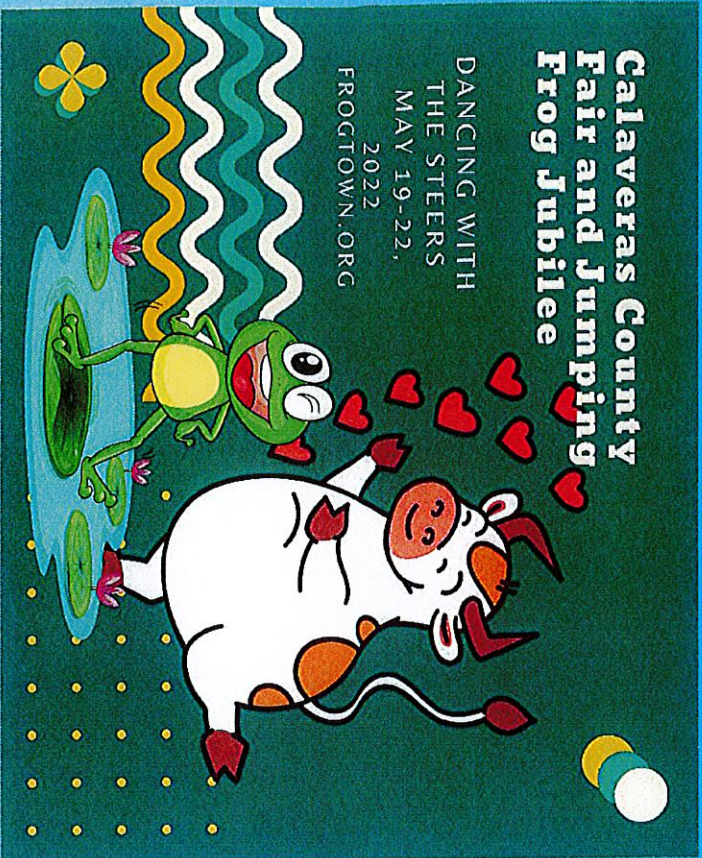
K. The Fun Jump:

- The Fun Jump is a non-competitive event in which Frog Jockeys of all ages jump frogs according to the three-jump rule, but without the strict constraints of Competitive Jumping. Photographs are allowed, adults may help young children jump their frog. The emphasis is on FUN.
- Each Fun Jump ticket allows jumping one frog, and includes a unique keepsake of the jump.
- Fun Jump staff will provide the frog, announce the entrant, measure the distance, and net the frog safely.
- Distances jumped by frogs in the Fun Jump are not eligible for the Grand Final's Top 50 Jumps.
- Fun Jump frogs are temporarily housed in the Frog Spa behind the Main Stage building, where visitors can learn more about the frogs at no charge. Hours are posted at the Frog Spa.

THE JUMPING FROG JUBILEE OF 1865

It was summer of 1865 and Calaveras County was a booming, roaring, mining frontier camp. The roads were bad and travel was slow, and so the miners did not venture far for amusement.

This was the setting for Mark Twain's first published work, *“The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County”* — the story of a gambler named Jim Smiley.

Jim, a miner and gambler, paraded the streets of Angels Camp with a basket under his arm, boasting about the ability of a certain frog. The local gambling houses, taverns and their proprietors all were acquainted with Jim's tales.

About this time, two slickers from New York arrived in town just ahead of an arrest warrant. They made their rounds to the gambling halls and such. On one of those occasions, they had the fortune of meeting Jim Smiley and were subject to Jim's boasting. The New Yorkers poked and prodded at Smiley until a contest and a wager ensued.

Old Jim was easily distracted and left his prize frog, Dan'l Webster, in the care of the strangers who quietly filled Jim's frog with buck shot. So you can guess the rest — the city slicker's frog out-jumped poor Dan'l, and Jim lost \$40 in gold.

Mark Twain, an up-and-coming American humorist who lived just across the Stanislaus River at Jackass Hill, was a frequent visitor to the Calaveras County mining camps.

Local legend has it that he heard the tall tale from Ross Coon, the proprietor of the Angels Hotel. Some believe Twain was encouraged by Greek Mythology.

Whatever the inspiration, Mark Twain inspired what has become the Calaveras County Fair & Jumping Frog Jubilee.

Jump for fun or in competition. Just \$5 a frog. Kids from 18 months to 80 years have jumped.

Rules of The Jump

Serious frog jockeys bring their own competitors, but anyone can rent a frog to join the fun.

Jubilee frogs come from all over Central and Northern California.

Competitors must be 4 inches from nose to rear end and must fit on an 8 inch pad.

Frogs placed on the pad are coaxed to leap three times and that distance is recorded.

The 50 longest marks qualify for the Grand Finals. Awards are presented to the eight longest leapers and there is a \$5,000 prize for anyone who can break the long-standing World's Record.
